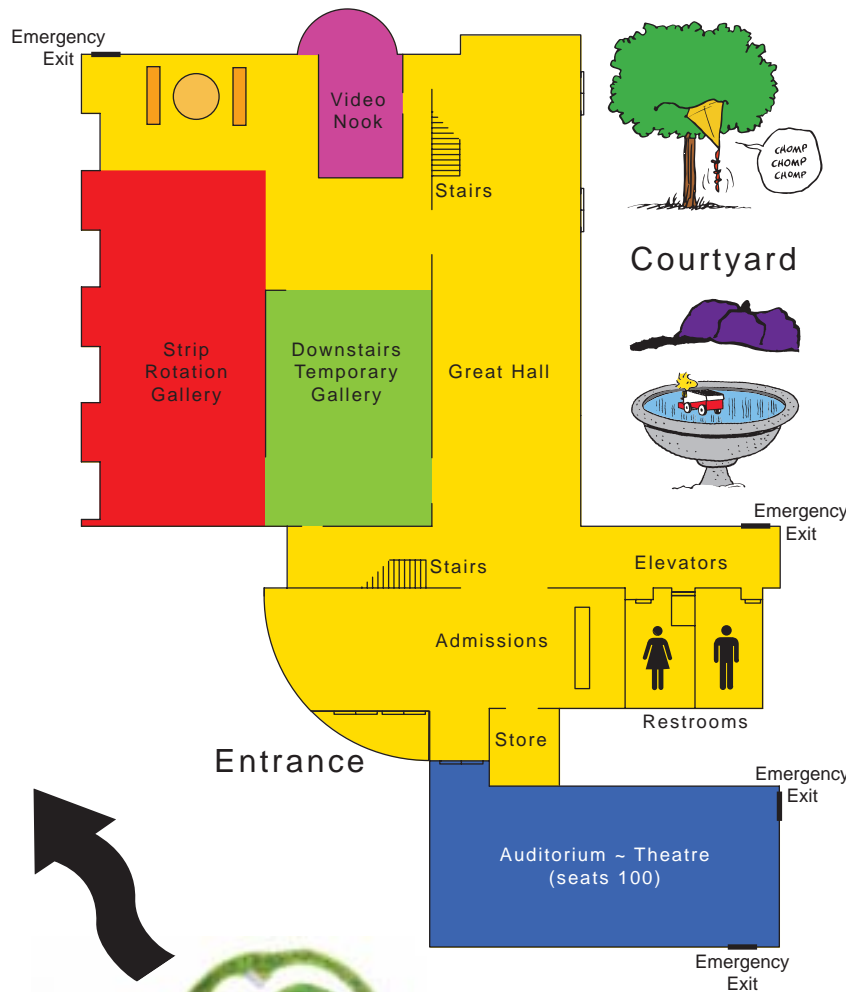

East of the Museum Entrance

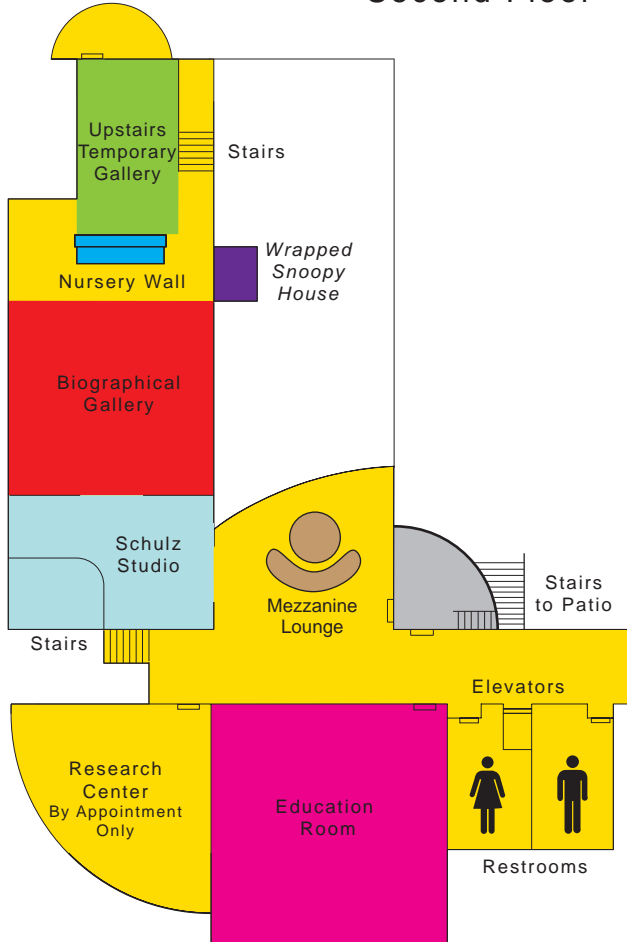

Schulz's timeline and biographical exhibitions
- **Schulz Studio**
Replication of Charles Schulz's studio

THINGS TO LEARN

- The exhibition *From Krazy Kat to Snoopy* illustrates how the work of early cartoonists, including Milt Caniff and Bill Mauldin, influenced Schulz
- Charlie Brown and Snoopy were featured on the cover of *Life* magazine in 1967

- Exhibition of **Peanuts** strips opened at the Musée du Louvre in Paris, France in 1990
Timeline – Biographical Gallery
- Schulz was a prolific reader whose tastes ranged from Dr. Spock to Dr. Seuss—see his library
